* Youth Forum

It was a fruitful afternoon for all the youths who participated in the Youth Forum – My City, My Dream, My Voice on 1 December 2012. It was wonderful to see the mixed age group of youths from different cultural backgrounds. Below are six key points that were discussed in depth at the forum:

- 1.**Toowoomba city infrastructure** The young people had ideas like mini buses to travel around the city to certain places like special parks and gardens.
- 2.**Youth at Risk** Ideas included non-denominational pre-marriage workshops and workshops with youths at risk to learn how they can lead more harmonious lives.
- 3.**Events** Toowoomba as a City of Peace and Harmony to participate in existing events like Peak to Park, Relay for Life, and Carnival of Flowers. Also have a mobile 'harmony' van at each event.
- 4.**Sports** Building the idea of peace and harmony through sports and particularly introducing multicultural sports activities. This group needed to find a venue, which could be PCYC or entail building a venue
- 5.**Education** More education about all religions from primary school up, and more languages (particularly more conversational languages) for fun and not for exams. The kids wanted to learn other languages by mixing with kids who speak it rather than sitting in a classroom. More education on respectful relationships.
- 6.**Avoiding culture clusters** Having more welcome events for new residents and mentoring.

These are valuable inputs from the youths. The organizing committee is in the process of studying the views and suggestions so these can be forwarded to the appropriate agencies or organizations for their feedback.
