Despite their apparent differences, the world's great religions, according to Bahá'ís, teach a fundamental truth. Bahá'ís believe in the oneness of humanity and devote themselves to the abolition of racial, class, and religious prejudices in accordance with the teachings of Bahá'u'lláh, Prophet Founder of the Bahá'í Faith.

It is a privilege and a pleasure to be part of TIWG, which works to establish such principles in our beautiful city of Toowoomba, where we are experiencing the development of a harmonious, multicultural society.
