

SPOTLIGHT ON TIWG MEMBERS: DR. ARSALAN MOZAFFARI FALARTI

Dr Arsalan Mozaffari Falarti, a distinguished member of the TIWG, has dedicated his life to community service and interfaith harmony.

Born in the historic city of Isfahan, Iran, Dr Arsalan comes from a family with a centuries-old legacy as Masters (Ghotb, Peer and Murad) in the Nematollahi Ghadeer Ali Shahi Muslim Sufi Order. He completed his academic studies in Iran and married at the age of twenty-four. His marriage has been blessed with a daughter and a son, both of whom have followed his path in academia.

Dr Arsalan began his professional journey as a consultant and advisor to the Mayor of Isfahan, focusing on the city's illumination, luminosity and beautification. His career soon expanded beyond Iran, and in the 1980s, his family made Australia their home.



Since settling in Australia, Dr Arsalan has been deeply committed to community service. His leadership and dedication have seen him contribute to various organisations, including:

- Vice President of the Islamic Society of St. Lucia
- Vice President of the Islamic Council of Queensland
- Founding Member of the Queensland Faith Communities Council

In addition to his service, Dr Arsalan is a Justice of the Peace (Qualified) and a Peace Ambassador, reflecting his ongoing commitment to justice, peace, and social cohesion.

With humility and a deep passion for fostering understanding among diverse communities, Dr Arsalan serves as an inspiration to many. His tireless efforts in promoting harmony and goodwill continue to make a lasting impact on all who have the privilege of working alongside him.
